

Tips for reading Bora aloud

1

Use the pictures on the side to play a searching game. Ask your child: 'Where is the owl?'; 'Can you find the birds?'. Also try switching roles so your child can say what you should search for.

There is not only a lot you can point out and name in the pictures; you can also talk with your child about what's happening. For example: Hedgehog is going to the shop and has a shopping list. Doggie scans all of the shopping items, and Squirrel pays for them.

A seek and find book helps you to notice what catches your child's attention, such as the animals coming down the slide, or Hedgehog jumping high on the trampoline. Your child will often look at you to see whether you have noticed something too. You can then react. You don't have to ask a question right away, however. You can also name and explain things. For example, you can explain that the see-saw isn't moving because Mouse is too light!

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
